RE: Cherokee ARES SET AAR Conducted 14OCT2023

Cherokee County Conducted the Annual SET- Simulated Emergency Training Exercises on October 14, 2023. The purpose of this exercise was to focus on Cherokee County being prepared for an activation, ensuring all activation processes, methods of communicating with members were validated, contact information on file is accurate, and members were able to follow our standard operating procedures.

The SET was initiated by W1JKU at the Cherokee County EOC 06:00am 14October 2023. We utilized various methods to notify our ARES Team including:

- 1- Sent Groups.IO message to our Cherokee ARES team, Cherokee Club members, and the Northwest GA ARES team to activate our members to join our NET and obtain additional instructions.
- 2- Updated the Cherokee-ARES website with summary of the activations driving members to our NET to obtain additional instructions.
- 3- Sent APRS message from both W1JKU (EC Cherokee) and WA4EOC (EOC Callsign) to notify members to join our ARES NET, message included the Frequency, Repeater Callsign and time of NET from 06:00- 09:50 EST.
- 4- Established DRATS NET to obtain Check-Ins and Pass information of our Activation utilizing the NWGA ARES Ratreflector and Channel "CCARES".
- 5- Established Phone/Voice Net was run by W1JKU initially from the EOC where detailed instructions into the Activation were provided. These instructions included tasks that members needed to perform including:
 - a. Send Winlink Check-In form to CCARES-NET.
 - b. Check into the DRATS NET.
 - c. Monitor APRS for callsign W1JKU and WA4EOC.
 - d. Instructions and Details of what each ARES Member needed to bring to the Mobilization Site, at the William G Long Senior Center.
 - e. Each member instructed they were to bring their mobile radio/HT along with instructions to program their Radi manually with a new Repeater Callsign that would

be provide at the Mobilization Station. Our Goal was to ensure each member could manually operate their equipment and perform this task under supervision.

- f. All tasks to be performed were tracked by an ARES Lead with a GO and NO-GO status. The goal was to identify areas of improvement in our focus going into 2024 to ensure we are ready when required.

Cherokee ARES then deployed Advance-Party teams to the William G Long Senior Center to establish coms and take over the NET from W1JKU, so W1JKU could relocated to the Mobilization Site.

1. KM4IEH-David and N4RFC-Bob deployed to William G Long and established field expedient VHF/UHF Auxiliary Communication site and took over the Cherokee ARES NET.
2. WB9GFA-Stan deployed to William G Long and established a field expedient 40-80m HF Auxiliary Communication site using NVIS End Fed Antenna 3 feet off the ground.
3. KO4UQF-Bill, KO4PWB-Rod, KJ4UC-Don deployed to William G Long to continue DRATS communications and provide additional assistance as needed and prepare to assist in mobilization inspections of the remaining members that would be arriving between 08:30 and 09:50.
4. KO4IFY-Mark deployed to William G Long as the Mobilization Officer ensuring ALL personnel arriving on site, were signed in/out, and that we had 100% accountability of all contact information, licenses, ICS training records, etc on file. Information that was out of date was corrected and individuals not a member of ARES and wanted to be, were given an opportunity to register and join the team.

As members arrived at the Mobilization site, they began the process of getting their records up to date. We performed a Show-Down Inspection of the material each member was required to bring, tested each member on their ability to manually program their radio, and lastly conducted the Annual Cherokee ARES Training. W1JKU performed ARES Training covering the Do's and Don'ts of being an ARES Member, Text Messaging via Winlink, APRS, Skywarn Overview, and EOC Operations. That presentation was published to the "[NEWS](#)" Page of the Cherokee-ARES.org website under the 14OCT2023 SET announcement.

Summary of Results

Sustain

1. As key members deployed, many enabled APRS tracking. Being able to real-time monitor the location of the personnel is a valuable tool for numerous reasons including Safety and Command and Control.
2. Cherokee County EMA relationship. Daniel Westbrook – EMA Directory and his team are completely supportive of Cherokee County ARES and have given us unattended access to the facility 24/7, and ensuring any equipment we need is operational and available.
3. Core ARES Professionalism including AEC and individual Active Members, and Club support that have a willingness and desire to accomplish the mission assigned and remain prepared to assist the community in time of need cannot go unnoticed. These members dedicate hours of time every week and personal expenses to ensure they are equipped and prepared when called upon.
4. Accurate tracking of all ARES Members with routine updates and confirmation of data, must continue...

Improve

1. We must continue the process of purging individuals from the ARES Active Rosters that do not meet the minimal standards. We have used our previous exercises and audit of participation records from the last year to ensure the rosters are accurate and reflect whom we can count on in case of emergency.
2. Continue to focus on training members on the following priority tasks:
 - a. Installing, managing, and operating Winlink, DRATS, and APRS (including APRSIS32, APRS.FI, and App on Mobile Phone.)
 - b. Having the ability to communicate over both Internet/Cell Service and RF is essential to our ability to provide support.
 - c. We spend a lot of time each month sending Winlink messages without ensuring the users have mastered the ability to self-configure the various tools, and when an issue occurs, they have the skills to troubleshoot and resolve themselves.
3. Must address the HF Antenna at EOC- Either need to make a new Antenna or consider commercial: [ICOM AH-710 Folder Dipole \(80' Long\) \\$359.99 plus tax](#)
4. Need to get Hamshack Hotline online at EOC- MAC address needs to be whitelisted on network.
5. Need to get CERT/ARES Trailer Operational. Currently sitting at Lake Arrowhead and not being maintained/kept serviceable. Need to get trailer moved to EOC for a few weeks to inventory, update, resolve and incorporate trailer into various activities throughout the year to ensure its operational when needed.
6. Need to follow up with members that received a NO-GO or did not complete the required training and then adjust the 2024 training plan to reinforce Mission Essential Tasks.
